
Young Voices



One program that thrives because of your commitment to New Collection and Toronto Public Library is Young Voices. In 2015, 20% of funds raised through New Collection were dedicated to this unique program.

Reaching over 1,000 youth in 2015, the program published the annual *Young Voices* magazine of teen writing and art, which received 543 submissions; the annual writer's conference with 145 attendees; art and writing workshops throughout the year with 271 attendees; and a Electronic Writer in Residence.

All aspects of Young Voices allow youth to connect with adult experts in the arts and with their peers and learn about potential career paths. With your support, Young Voices provides Toronto's young people – from all walks of life – with experiences that build their artistic skills, deepen their character, and change their lives for the better.
