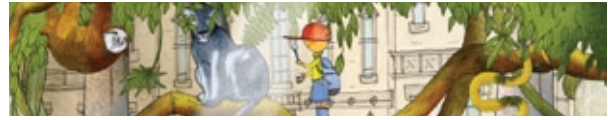
## Renewed support extends summer reading club to teens

The TD Summer Reading Club encouraged more than 280,000 Canadian children under 12 to devour almost 2.5 million books this year. Remarkable? Absolutely.

But when they renewed their financial support in 2011, TD Bank Group upped the ante by casting a wider net. As part of a \$2 million pledge to be used in 2012-2014, TD earmarked \$75,000 for a teen program to get more youth reading too.

The funding will enrich the Toronto Public Library's Word Out program, which launched last year. The summer reading website for teens offers a list of library-recommended books for teens to read over the course of the summer. Youth readers have an opportunity to express their thoughts about the books in writing and even post video reviews.

In 2011, 11 authors of recommended titles also contributed to the blog through interviews.



As a testament to teen participation, many of the titles featured on the blog circulated more during the summer period than at any other time in the year.

At the end of a long summer of reading, many branches hosted wrap-up parties that featured music, snacks, games and other fun activities so teen readers could meet in person and continue their online conversations.

With the additional financial support, the website will be enhanced and more features added to further increase teen participation.

## Financial literacy comes full circle at the Toronto Public Library

Enjoying the Toronto Public Library can be a lucrative way to spend some time. No one knew that better than the late Norman G. Hinton, who amassed a small fortune using the Toronto Public Library's wealth of resources.

Mr. Hinton became a self-made investment guru, developing keen financial literacy skills, researching stock trends and managing a wildly successful portfolio, all from the comfort of his local library. Though he died in 2009 at the age of 79, his savvy spirit will live on at the Library for thousands of Torontonians. In 2011, Mr. Hinton's life's work came full circle when his estate bequeathed over \$1,000,000 to the Toronto Public Library Foundation.

"Norman was a staunch supporter of the Toronto Public Library. He valued its resources, both for his own needs and also for the

betterment of the city." said David Mattinson, Friend and Executor of the Estate of Norman G. Hinton. "I know that Norman would have been pleased to see how his gift will benefit the people of Toronto."

The generous gift will honour Mr. Hinton's passion for financial literacy by enhancing the Library's collections and programs supporting small business development and investment knowledge. Other fortunes may be made as a portion is devoted to small business support programs and an endowment fund will be created to permanently support financial literacy programs.

Patrons looking to follow in his successful footsteps will be able to visit the Norman G. Hinton Learning Theatre - a learning hub on the third floor of the Toronto Reference Library - in 2013.

## Baillie gift makes new home for compelling collection

In 2011, the Toronto Public Library Foundation continued to be heartened by the generosity of donors in support of *re:vitalize - Toronto Reference Library Campaign*.

Marilyn and Charles Baillie are serious about preserving Canada's heritage and making it accessible to everyone.

In 2011 they expressed their extraordinary commitment with a \$1.5 million gift in support of the Toronto Public Library Foundation's *re:vitalize - Toronto Reference Library Campaign*.

"The library is the educational, social and cultural centre of the city," Charles said. "If we want a flourishing society, we all need to do what we can."

Their generous support allows for the creation of a Special Collections Centre at the Toronto Reference Library that will bring together the Library's collection of 1.9 million pieces of Canadiana, including historical maps and photos, original manuscripts and first editions. The new centre has been designed to include a two-storey rotunda and reading room.

"There's so much richness in the library," said Marilyn. "Touring these items is like pulling out special jewels. They help us become aware of our history; they help us understand what it is to be Canadian."

As much as the Baillies value history, they also appreciate the powerful connections people of all walks of life make when visiting libraries. Their gift ensures all Torontonians can access and enjoy incredible artifacts from our nation's past.

The Marilyn & Charles Baillie Special Collections Centre will open in 2013.



## Family gift funds improvements to Barbara Frum branch

The Barbara Frum Library Branch will be revitalized thanks to a major gift from Dr. Murray Frum and family. The \$100,000 gift will fund improvements to be phased in over four years, including new floors, shelving and seating and new service zones for early literacy and computer learning.

"My family is very pleased to help Toronto Public Library realize a more responsive and better equipped library for the future," said Dr. Murray Frum.

The Barbara Frum Branch - located in the Lawrence and Bathurst area - continues to be



one of the Library's busiest district branches. The branch was named in honour of famed journalist Barbara Frum, who died in 1992.

## Fundraising festival unites literary community with readers

Something magical happens when writers connect with their readers in an authentic and original way. A community comes together to celebrate the written word and two incredible causes get the support they deserve.

The third annual Globe and Mail Open House Festival presented by Random House of Canada accomplished a spirit of camaraderie and mutual respect with a star-studded weekend that brought in \$68,000 split between the Toronto Public Library Foundation and Frontier College.

Highlights of the 2011 event, which took place April 28 to May 1st at multiple venues across the city, included a talk by esteemed author Alexander McCall Smith to a sold-out crowd; a panel discussion featuring luminaries Romeo Dallaire, James Dallaire, James Orbinski and Izzeldin Abuelaish; and a show-stopping musical tribute to literature produced by singer/songwriter Dave Bidini.

According to Scott Sellers, Vice President, Director of Marketing Strategy at Random House of Canada, it was imperative to festival organizers that a portion of the proceeds would go directly to the Toronto Public Library Foundation.

“Libraries nurture readers and we can’t overestimate how important is the role they play in our culture. As publishers, we know they have to be supported because they help to create our audience.”

Since its inception in 2009, the festival has gathered steam and plans are in the works for an annual event through 2014.

“Before this festival, there was a real lack of venues to connect writers with their readers and also for the community to come together to share ideas,” added Sellers. “The festival has become a place where an esoteric mixture of thoughts can come to grow.” If uptake from the community is any indication, the seeds have been sown.

## Give Joy campaign takes off in 2011

Library lovers across Toronto were infused with the holiday spirit in 2011 during the second annual Give Joy campaign.

Thanks to the generosity of 200 donors, the program raised \$8,700 for the Toronto Public Library Foundation, an increase of more than \$3,000 from the year before.

Give Joy allows users to make a donation to Toronto’s Library in the name of a special someone. For donations over \$10, the recipient receives a seasonal card in the mail. The many Library customers who choose to make a

smaller donation at their local branch are thanked with a Give Joy bookmark.



Toronto lawyer Esther Lenkinski bought 200 holiday cards in 2011 to give to clients and other business associates in lieu of a standard Christmas card.

“It’s a nice way to recognize people and do something that’s meaningful and contributes to the community,” she said.

## Transformational gift breathes new life into special collections

The Toronto Public Library Foundation has received an exceptional gift that ensures the one-of-a-kind Canadiana and Performing Arts collections will be enriched in ways public funds alone could never achieve.

Philanthropist Johanna Metcalf, the Metcalf family and the George Cedric Metcalf Foundation donated \$250,000 in honour of Johanna's partner, the late Mr. Justice Robert F. Reid. This extraordinary gift enables the creation of the new Robert F. Reid Special Collections Acquisition Fund, which will be dedicated to acquiring items to complement, complete and enhance the Library's Canadiana and Performing Arts Collections.

"This is truly a transformational gift," said Heather Rumball, President, Toronto Public Library Foundation. "Through their generosity, the Metcalf family is ensuring that today's - and tomorrow's - students, scholars, historians and life-long learners will have even more opportunities to explore, uncover and re-discover treasures from Canada's historical and cultural records."

The Metcalf family also made a \$50,000 donation to support the Toronto Public Library Foundation's *re:vitalize - Toronto Reference Library Campaign*. The late Mr. Justice Reid will be recognized in association with a viewing room in the Library's new Marilyn & Charles Baillie Special Collections Centre.

## Festival's gift means Caribbean culture stays alive in Library, city

When the Scotiabank Caribbean Carnival Toronto committee needed to choose a charity that their annual fundraising gala would support, board member Dr. Rita Cox had the perfect fit.

What better recipient than a place where people of Black and Caribbean heritage, students, researchers and curious Torontonians could go to learn about the rich history and experiences of the Caribbean culture?

The Black and Caribbean Heritage Collection, available at four Toronto Public Library branches, was founded by Cox in 1998 when she was head of the Parkdale branch. It features more than 16,000 print and audiovisual materials about the Black and Caribbean historical and cultural experience.

In 2006, the Collection was renamed the Rita Cox Black and Caribbean Heritage Collection, in honour of its founder. The Rita Cox Endowment Fund was established within the Toronto Public Library Foundation to support the enhancement and growth of the Collection.

"Not only does the collection exist to encourage Caribbean people born here, it also tells the rest of the community about their African and Caribbean neighbours," said Cox. "We live in a multicultural society and it's important that we learn from one another."

The festival's gala raised more than \$5,000, which was promptly matched by a \$5,000 gift from Scotiabank for a total gift of \$10,000 in support of the Endowment Fund to ensure the collection stays vital and relevant for all.

"I'm grateful for the donation and the Toronto Public Library for their great support from the beginning. The collection keeps the story of my people alive and introduces us and all of our aspects to the wider community. That's invaluable," said Cox.



## Marquis fundraising event proved to be smashing success

Which fundraising event was *Black, White and Read All Over* and raised an astounding \$480,000 for the Toronto Public Library?

The Book Lover's Ball, voted one of Toronto's best fundraisers and a marquis event for the Library.

The sixth annual event brought together 600 book lovers and literary talents like Camilla Gibb, Kate Taylor, Lawrence Hill, Linwood Barclay and Stuart McLean to support the busiest urban public library system in the world.

Highlights of the evening included French-inspired hors d'oeuvres prepared by celebrity chef Marc Thuet and a fashion show that celebrated the city's cultural diversity and its internationally read authors.

The purpose of the evening was never far from of the minds of its esteemed attendees, who were characteristically enthusiastic about the silent auction and raffle sales. Adopt a

Branch, a new program that allowed donors to contribute \$500 toward a branch of their choice, raised \$22,000 alone.

Presenting sponsor Sun Life Financial and other major sponsors were instrumental in helping the Foundation produce The Book Lover's Ball, including Toronto Star, TD Bank, Whitehots Inc., Harlequin and Rogers.



## Anonymous donation endures two years later

It's the gift that keeps on giving.

The \$1 million that was donated by an anonymous donor in 2009 continued to work its magic straight through 2011 and beyond.

One of the programs made possible by this gift allowed the Toronto Public Library to reach out to parents and caregivers in non-traditional locations to help them support their children's pre-literacy skills.

In 2011, Outreach Services Specialist Tara Stadius connected with more than 800 children and caregivers to share the tremendously effective **Ready for Reading** storytime program and workshops in community centres and other locations.

The donation was also used to access parents who might not otherwise receive literacy information. Stadius held information booths at several workplaces, including six hotels, four factories and the Toronto General Hospital.

In all, 9,268 employees learned more about the importance of early literacy and how to integrate it into their family life.

Work also continued on a Ready for Reading resource guide, a book designed to advise Canadian parents and caregivers on how to build reading readiness in their children from birth to five years of age. The resource guide will showcase the Toronto Public Library's critical expertise and leadership in the fields of early literacy and children's literature, as well as tips, activities, a list of great books for preschoolers and links to other resources.

The gift also supported the creation of a circulating collection of accreditation and skills enhancement materials at the Toronto Reference Library, the addition of thousands of items to the Library's multilingual collection to build up collections of general materials to meet the growing demand from newcomers, and the *re:vitalize - Toronto Reference Library Campaign*.

## CELEBRATING OUR VOLUNTEERS

### Friends of Toronto Public Library, North and South Chapters

The Friends of Toronto Public Library, North and South Chapters have been generous supporters of the Library for over 15 years. Each year, over 100 volunteers dedicate 11,500 hours of service in support of raising funds through the operation of two used book stores – Book Ends and Book Ends South – for numerous programs at Toronto Public Library.

In 2011, the Friends of Toronto Public Library, North Chapter provided \$51,000 in support of the Library's Leading to Reading program and *re:vitalize - Toronto Reference Library Campaign*.

The Friends of Toronto Public Library, South Chapter donated \$62,000 in support of a variety of Library programs, including Dial-A-Story, English Can Be Fun and funds for programming at the Toronto Reference Library.

Thus far, the Friends of Toronto Public Library have jointly raised over \$1 million in support of Toronto Public Library programs.

### Library proves to be great 'return on investment' for volunteer

When George Fierheller was approached to join the Toronto Public Library's Governors' Council, his instinct was to do what he always does when people ask for help: say yes.

But it wasn't until he was given a tour of the Toronto Reference Library and its remarkable collections that he understood the impact his help would have on the community.

"The deciding factor was when I met with Heather Rumball about it. She showed me around and put on quite an interesting display of the things they're doing. I didn't know about many of the fascinating collections. I was very impressed."

Fierheller refers to himself as a 'used executive'. He retired from being Vice Chairman of Rogers Communications in 1996. A volunteer for just about everything, he has been Chair, Board of Governors, Carleton University; Chair, Finance Committee, Simon Fraser; on the Executive Committee of the National Arts Centre; Chair, Toronto Board of Trade; and is a Director of the Canadian Institute for Advanced Research.

He has chaired the United Way campaigns in Ottawa, Vancouver and Toronto, and is the author of several books and a recipient of numerous awards, including the Order of Canada.

With a resume like that, he's ideally suited to be a member of the Governors' Council, which is committed to fostering relationships with people of vision to provide Toronto's Library with improved and expanded collections, enhanced programs and services and revitalized community spaces.

"One of the main things I've been able to help with is to contact people I think would also be interested in the Library who might know very little about it," he said.

"I feel the Library is a great return on one's investment in both time and money. It helps an awful lot of people – new people in the community, young people and entrepreneurs just starting to give them confidence as they move forward in their lives, and so many more."

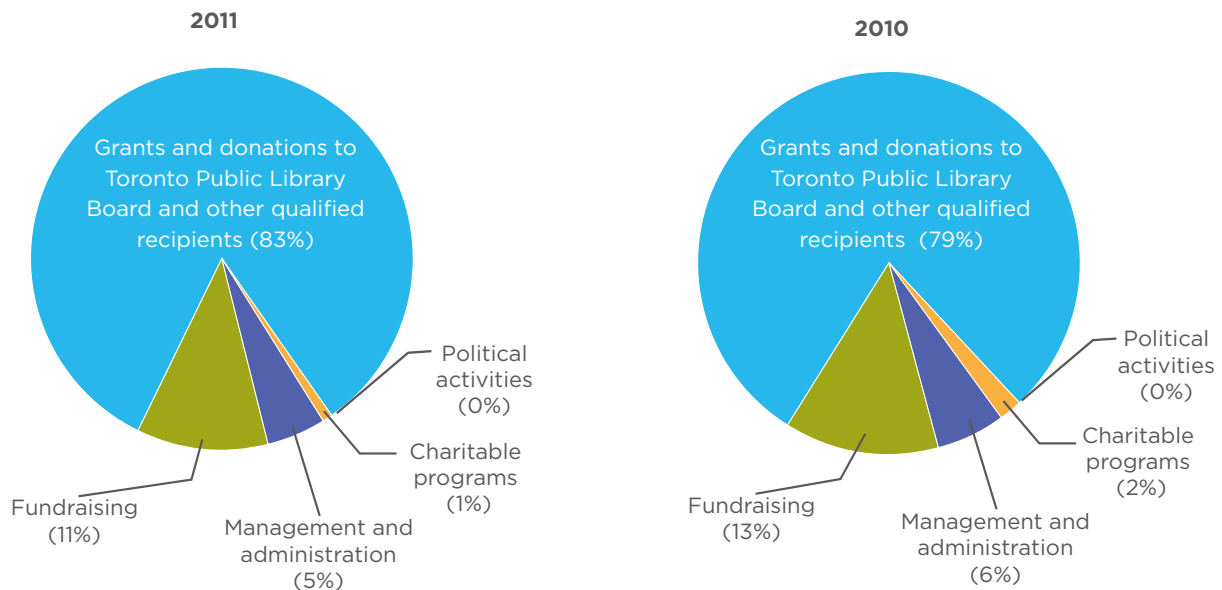

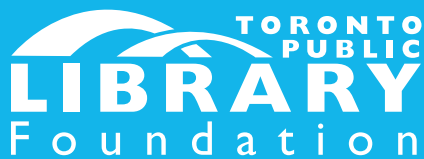
