



Biblio Bash Raises Nearly \$700,000 for Youth Empowerment Programs and Services at Toronto Public Library

Toronto, ON (May 1, 2018) – Last week, the Toronto Reference Library was once again transformed into a glamorous black-tie gala for **Biblio Bash**, presented by TD Bank Group. Bringing together 43 of Canada's top authors, local philanthropists, entrepreneurs and arts and culture supporters, the evening raised more than \$692,000 through ticket and table sales, a silent auction and onsite donations. Money raised will help support Toronto Public Library's (TPL) programs and services that empower youth in vulnerable neighbourhoods across the city.

More than 470 guests attended the sold-out event hosted by Canadian author, investor and television personality **David Chilton**. Each table featured a Canadian author host, including notables such as *Giller Prize* winners **Michael Redhill** (*Bellevue Square, 2017*) and **Esi Edugyan** (*Half-Blood Blues, 2011*); New York Times Bestseller **Shari Lapena** (*The Couple Next Door*); Toronto chef and cookbook author **Matt Dean Pettit**; novelist, screenwriter and journalist **Heather O'Neill** (*Lullabies for Little Criminals*); Order of Canada recipients, **Joy Kogawa** (*Obasan*), **Thomas King** (*The Inconvenient Indian*) and children's poet **Dennis Lee** (*Alligator Pie*); and acclaimed author and playwright **Ann-Marie MacDonald**, among others. For the second year in a row, **Biblio Bash's** Author Host Sponsor was the Gerald Sheff and Shanitha Kachan Charitable Foundation.

The evening kicked off with a champagne welcome, sponsored by Toronto Life, and a buzz-worthy cocktail reception held among the stacks of the Library, sponsored by the Mantella Corporation. Guests mixed, mingled and enjoyed Mumm's Champagne and oysters while browsing featured photos from the Toronto Star Archives as accomplished saxophonist Miles Raine performed live.

Following the reception, guests made their way to the main floor for the evening's program with event sponsor Whitehots Inc. returning as a TPLF event partner for the 12th consecutive year. Toronto-based slam poetry group, **The Uncharted**, set the tone for the night with a striking performance commissioned exclusively for **Biblio Bash 2018**. Members of the group teach Toronto teens in the popular TPL program, Poetry Saved Our Lives.

Food Network Canada personality, award-winning restaurateur and renowned **Chef Cory Vitiello** with 10tation Catering, prepared a custom-designed meal featuring a shaved candy cane beet and watermelon radish salad with fresh favas, spring asparagus and buffalo mozzarella, and a braised beef short rib accompanied with potato and fresh horseradish croquette. Dinner sponsor Labatt supplied Stella Artois beer service during the second course, and Balzac's sponsored delicious dessert treats that included chocolate covered strawberries and macarons. The coffee roaster also gifted Atwood Blend Coffee to guests.

Throughout the night, Chilton's charm had guests opening up their hearts (and wallets) to drive up the bidding for exclusive silent auction items such as a breathtaking trip to Fogo Island, a family staycation at Hotel X Toronto (by Library Hotel Collection), as well as trips to New York City and Quebec City, tickets to the Raptors and Blue Jays, and jewellery from Maison Birks. Also up for auction was a once-in-a-lifetime book club dinner with Canadian literary icon, **Margaret Atwood**. While the legendary author wasn't able to attend, Atwood did lend her support of TPL earlier in the week by taking to Twitter to encourage donations:

Additional highlights of the evening included the premiere of "*I'm Library People*" – a documentary short film commissioned by TPLF and directed by Official Pictures featuring heart-warming, honest tales from Canadians about how the Library has impacted their life in a meaningful way. Featured Canadians include media personality, **George Stroumboulopoulos**; award winning author, **Joy Kogawa**; and Ontario Supreme Court Justice, **Donald McLeod**. A guest-curated music playlist from the Library's epic collection of 15,000-plus vinyl records was spun by **DJ Wade O. Brown** and soulful R & B singer, **Sean Jones** and his band **The Collective** had the crowd on their feet dancing into the night. Celebrity photographer, **George Pimentel** ran his signature pop-up portrait studio, sponsored by Rogers Communications, artistically designing an exquisite library parlour with vintage furniture pieces and adorned with more than 1,600 books from Toronto Public Library.

"It was incredible to see the Reference Library filled with such passionate Library supporters, all coming together to empower at-risk youth," commented Jennifer Jones, President of TPLF. "Ensuring that the Library remains a thriving community hub is at the core of what we do at the Foundation and with the help of donors, we can ensure TPL continues to create free, life-changing programs, services and spaces for all Torontonians."
